

Is Economic Transformation Happening in Africa?

- Africa's recent growth has not yet translated into structural transformation.
- Agriculture is still the predominant source of employment while high valueadded industries such as manufacturing remain stagnant.
- Productivity of manufacturing sector is low compared with the other regions.

Distribution of Employment in SSA (% of total labor force, 2010)





How can Africa Create More Complex and Value-Added Products?

- Existing studies of SSA economies show:
 - Low levels of economic complexity, with limited productive capabilities (Bhorat et. al, 2017).
 - Low participation rate in manufacturing GVCs (Yameogo & Jammeh, 2019).

Export Composition, SSA and Asia (1995 vs. 2013)




What are the Capabilities Needed for Generating Innovation?

- Research and development generates new knowledge that can be applied through innovation, but does not drive it (UNCTAD, 2017).
- Innovation outputs are associated with better management practices (Cierra and Maloney, 2017).
