Agenda 2063

Algeria is among 31 African countries to have shared their first national progress report on Agenda 2063's first Ten-Year Implementation Plan. The first-ever continental report assesses progress made at the national, regional and continental levels towards achieving Africa's developmental goals. The report was launched at the 2020 January AU Summit by President of Côte d'Ivoire, Alassane Ouattara.

High-speed train

The African Integrated High-Speed Railway Network scoping detailed study was completed and validated. The next phase is to develop a feasibility study that will complement the PIDA II effort based on improving and existing lines from meter to standard gauge as well as their technical parameters/characteristics.

Multimodal transport connectivity for economic development

Preparations of the feasibility study on the trans-Maghreb highway commenced.

Presidential Infrastructure Champion Initiative (PICI)

To-date, 12 African Heads of State and Government (including the Head of State of Algeria) are championing cross-border infrastructure projects. Membership is increasing over time, reflecting the unequivocal commitment of African leaders to significantly upscale infrastructure across the continent.

Virtual PIDA information centre

Data collection on PIDA commenced in five countries, one of which is Algeria, in the UMA region.

Strengthening Africa Medical Health Regulation

- » Domestication of AU Model Law on Medical Products to improve access to safe and high quality medicines
- » The Treaty for the Africa Medicines Agency (AMA) was endorsed at AU summit level and is ready for signatures by AU Member States. Three countries have already signed the treaty, one of which is Algeria.
