African Biosafety Network of Expertise

- » Establishment and strengthening of biosafety and security systems in 17 countries, including Ghana.
- » In Ghana, technical support was provided to the National Biosafety Authority to prepare regulations for implementing the biosafety law.

Agenda 2063

Ghana is among 31 African countries to have shared their first national progress report on Agenda 2063's first Ten-Year Implementation Plan. The first-ever continental report assesses progress made at the national, regional and continental levels towards achieving Africa's developmental goals. The report was launched at the 2020 January AU Summit by President of Côte d'Ivoire, Alassane Ouattara.

Grow Africa

- » Boosting private sector participation in Africa's agricultural transformation.
- » Support was provided towards the establishment of country agribusiness partnership frameworks (CAP-F) in 11 countries, one of which is Ghana.

Integrated Vector Management

- » Curbing vector-borne diseases such as malaria and dengue fever.
- » Developed harmonised guidelines and other regulatory tools for regional collaboration among Member States in West Africa to regulate vector control. The efforts resulted in assisted- and joint evaluations of vector control tools.

Elaborating Scope and Baseline

- » A detailed appraisal of national and regional industrialisation policies and plans.
- » 33 national and four regional industrialisation policies/plans in COMESA, SADC, EAC and ECOWAS (including Ghana) were appraised. The report will be launched in 2020.

Launch of Integrated Irrigation and Agri-Industry Initiative

16 countries, including Ghana, will be supported to operationalise programmes at field level. The initiative aims to foster public-private collaboration along the agriculture and food systems value chain.

Home Grown School Feeding

- » Fight against malnutrition in schools through community-driven nutrition driven food supply.
- » 15 countries, including Ghana, are implementing the Home-Grown School Feeding Programme.
- » Implemented and trained three countries, one of which is Ghana, on the use of School Meal Planners (SMP) to ensure nutritious and healthy school meals.
- » In Ghana more than 3,000 school-feeding implementers were trained.

Initiative for Food and Nutrition Security in Africa (IFNA)

- » Strengthening maternal and child feeding.
- » 12 participating countries, including Ghana, have finalised and validated national nutrition action plans.
- » Ghana has finalised and validated national nutrition action plans.

Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)

STEM Education was launched and needs assessments were undertaken in five countries, including Ghana.

Skills Initiative for Africa (SIFA)

- » Empowerment and skills development for youth.
- » The SIFA Programme is operating in seven countries, including Ghana.

Strengthening African Medical Health Regulation

- » Domestication of AU Model Law on Medical Products.
- » 28 countries, including Ghana, are at different stages towards domesticating the AU Model Law on Medical Products.
- » 14 Member States are implementing the Model Law.

Vocational and Entrepreneurship

- » Training for women and youth employment.
- » Supported the integration and alignment of technical and vocational education and training (TVET) into national qualification frameworks in 15 countries, including Ghana.
- » Strengthened capacities of 12 CAADP ATVET countries, one of which is Ghana.
- » A toolkit on "Private Sector Engagement in ATVET" was developed.
- » ATVET for Women is in full operation in Ghana.

Job creation toolkit for infrastructure projects

The PIDA job creation toolkit was launched. The toolkit estimates, amongst others, direct, indirect and induced jobs in job years during the preparation, construction and O&M phase.

Policy and regulatory frameworks for PIDA projects

21 countries, including Ghana, were trained on water governance and international law with regards to transboundary waters in Africa.

Move Africa

- » Addressing challenges pertaining to transboundary trade and logistical challenges.
- » Focus was placed on creating synergies between RECs in the roll-out of the Traffic Light System (TLS), which is a benchmarking tool to measure performance of joint and one-stop border posts. To-date, the TLS has been rolled out in select countries in ECOWAS, one of which is Ghana.

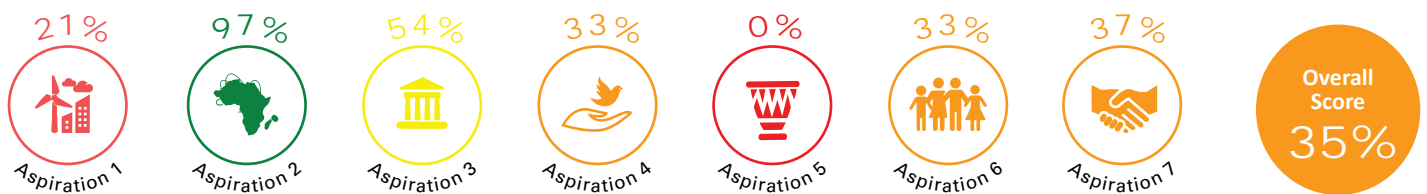
Sustainable Land Management

26 Countries, including Ghana, pledged to restore 125 million hectares to reduce land degradation and desertification; create sustainable jobs; and improve food security and resilient communities.

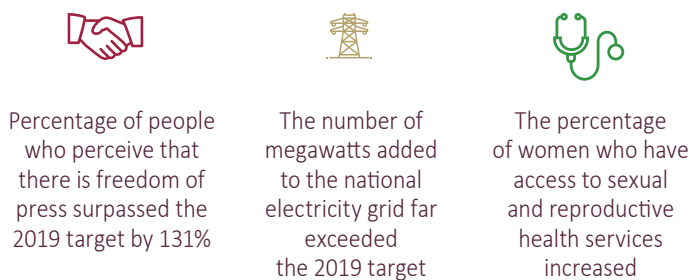
Ghana on Implementation of Agenda 2063



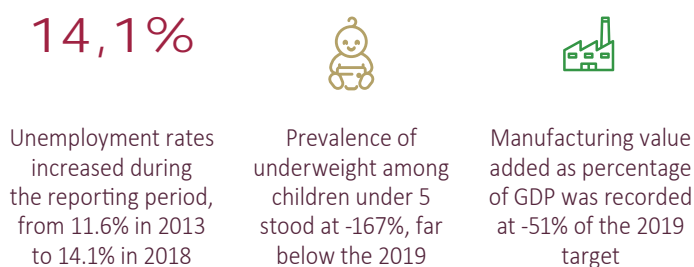
