## African Biosafety Network of Expertise

Establishment and strengthening of biosafety and security systems in 17 countries, including Malawi.

## Grow Africa

- » CAP-Fs were operationalised and potential investors for the agricultural sector were identified.
- » Companies from Grow Africa's Investment Pipeline signed Term Sheets with the governments a number of AU Member States, including Malawi.

## Elaborating Scope and Baseline

33 national and four regional industrialisation policies/plans in COMESA, SADC, EAC and ECOWAS (including Malawi) were appraised. The report will be launched in 2020.

## Launch of Integrated Irrigation and Agri-Industry Initiative

16 countries, including Malawi, will be supported to operationalise programmes at field level. The initiative aims to foster public-private collaboration along the agriculture and food systems value chain.

## Enhanced Use of Country Results Framework (CRFs)

Undertook assessments of national development finance flows and taxes towards the development of integrated financing strategies and plans.

## Eradication of TB and prevention of occupational lung diseases in vulnerable population

- » A total of 11 occupational health service centres providing TB screening and diagnosis services, HIV testing; silicosis screening and diagnosis; and links of ex-mine workers to compensation funds are now operational in eight countries, one of which is in Malawi.
- » Regional occupational health and safety inspection guidelines were drafted to support harmonisation of inspection activities in the mines and non-mining industries. Malawi has used these to update their national guidelines.
- » Data was collected in Malawi on the potential role and value addition of the private sector in controlling TB.

## Home Grown School Feeding

- » Fight against malnutrition in schools through community-driven nutrition driven food supply.
- » 15 countries, including Malawi, are implementing the Home- Grown School Feeding Programme.

## Inclusion of indigenous food in Africa's nutritious food basket

A knowledge compendium of integrated best practices and approaches for inclusion of indigenous food in Africa's nutritious food basket was developed from 12 countries, including Malawi.

## Initiative for Food and Nutrition Security in Africa (IFNA)

12 participating countries, including Malawi, have finalised and validated national nutrition action plans.

## Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)

STEM Education was launched and needs assessments were undertaken in five countries, including Malawi.

## Skills Initiative for Africa (SIFA)

National action plans for rural youth employment and entrepreneurship were developed and validated in Malawi.

## Strengthening Africa Medical Health Regulation

28 countries, including Malawi, are at different stages towards domesticating the AU Model Law on Medical Products. 14 Member States are implementing the Model Law.

## Vocational and Entrepreneurship

- » Supported the integration and alignment of technical and vocational education and training (TVET) into national qualification frameworks in 15 countries, including Malawi.
- » ATVET for Women is in full operation in Malawi.
- » An index on women's empowerment in agriculture was developed to determine the impact of ATVET interventions, which was piloted and administered in Malawi.

## Climate Change Responses

The Gender Climate and Agriculture nexus project was implemented in five initial countries, including Malawi, which resulted in the mainstreaming of climate-smart agriculture practices and the development of CSA infrastructure.

## Renewable Energy

- » To increase deployment of renewable energy technologies, especially mini-grid solutions to accelerate universal energy access while increasing productive capacity, resilience building and human wellbeing.
- » High-impact micro-grid projects in 11 countries, including Uganda, were identified where energy accessibility is the lowest.

## Sustainable Land Management

26 Countries, including Malawi, pledged to restore 125 million hectares to reduce land degradation and desertification; create sustainable jobs; and improve food security and resilient communities.

## Job creation toolkit for infrastructure projects

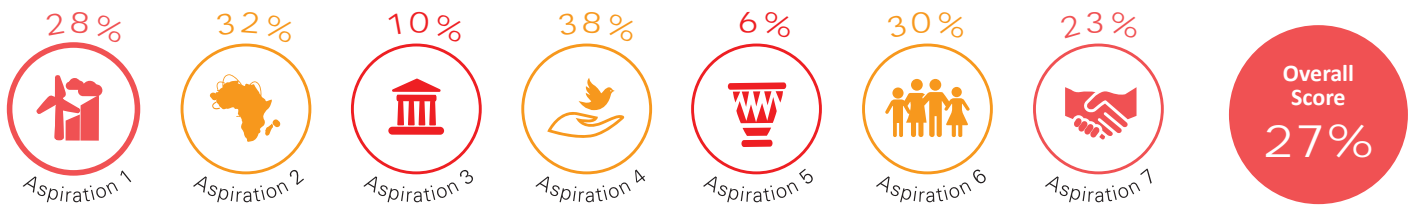
The PIDA job creation toolkit was launched. The toolkit estimates, amongst others, direct, indirect and induced jobs in job years during the preparation, construction and O&M phase.

## Policy and regulatory frameworks for PIDA projects

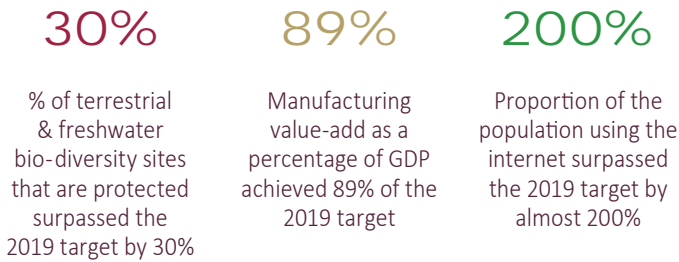
- » 21 countries, including Malawi, were trained on water governance and international law with regards to transboundary waters in Africa.

# Southern Africa Dashboard on Implementation of Agenda 2063

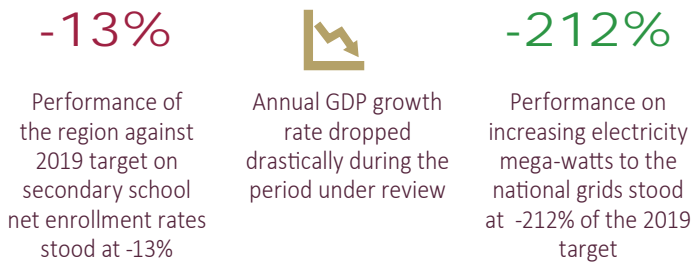

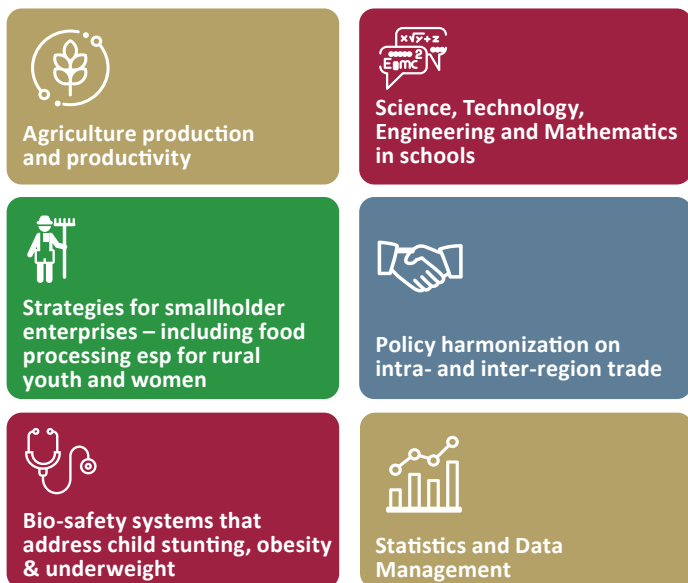
### Areas where significant progress has been made
