Agenda 2063

Sudan is among 31 African countries to have shared their first national progress report on Agenda 2063's first Ten-Year Implementation Plan. The first-ever continental report assesses progress made at the national, regional and continental levels towards achieving Africa's developmental goals. The report was launched at the 2020 January AU Summit by President of Côte d'Ivoire, Alassane Ouattara.

African Biosafety Network of Expertise

Establishment and strengthening of biosafety and security systems in 17 countries, including Sudan.

Launch of Integrated Irrigation and Agri-Industry Initiative

16 countries, including Sudan, will be supported to operationalise programmes at field level. The initiative aims to foster public-private collaboration along the agriculture and food systems value chain.

Gender

- » Empowerment of African women.
- » Modernised business incubators for women in six countries, including Sudan.

Initiative for Food and Nutrition Security in Africa (IFNA)

- » Strengthening maternal and child feeding.
- » 12 participating countries, including Sudan, have finalised and validated national nutrition action plans.

Policy and regulatory frameworks for PIDA projects

21 countries, including Sudan, were trained on water governance and international law with regards to transboundary waters in Africa.

Presidential Infrastructure Champion Initiative (PICI)

To-date, 12 African Heads of State and Government (including the Heads of State of Sudan) are championing cross-border infrastructure projects. Membership is increasing over time, reflecting the unequivocal commitment of African leaders to significantly upscale infrastructure across the continent.

Sustainable Land Management

26 Countries, including Sudan, pledged to restore 125 million hectares to reduce land degradation and desertification; create sustainable jobs; and improve food security and resilient communities.
