Corridor investment plans for Programme for Infrastructure Development (PIDA)

A corridor development investment plan (CDIP) and marketing plan were drafted to develop and implement selected PIDA priority projects in Transport, Energy, Transboundary Water, and Telecommunication and IT.

Elaborating Scope and Baseline

- » A detailed appraisal of national and regional industrialisation policies and plans.
- » 33 national and four regional industrialisation policies/plans in COMESA, SADC, EAC and ECOWAS (including Gambia) were appraised. The report will be launched in 2020.

Integrated Vector Management

- » Curbing vector-borne diseases such as malaria and dengue fever.
- » Developed harmonised guidelines and other regulatory tools for regional collaboration among Member States in West Africa to regulate vector control. The efforts resulted in assisted-and joint evaluations of vector control tools.

African Skills Portal for Youth Employment and Entrepreneurship

African Ministers of TVET and Education endorsed a knowledge sharing platform to promote African-owned innovative approaches for skills development and decent employment on the continent. The platform - the African Skills Portal for Youth Employment and Entrepreneurship (ASPYEE), aims to promote African-owned innovative approaches for skills development and decent employment on the continent.

Launch of Integrated Irrigation and Agri-Industry Initiative

16 countries, including Gambia, will be supported to operationalise programmes at field level. The initiative aims to foster public-private collaboration along the agriculture and food systems value chain.

Strengthening Africa Medical Health Regulation

- » Domestication of AU Model Law on Medical Products to improve access to safe and high quality medicines.
- » 28 countries, including Gambia, are at different stages towards domesticating the AU Model Law on Medical Products.

Gender and Women Empowerment

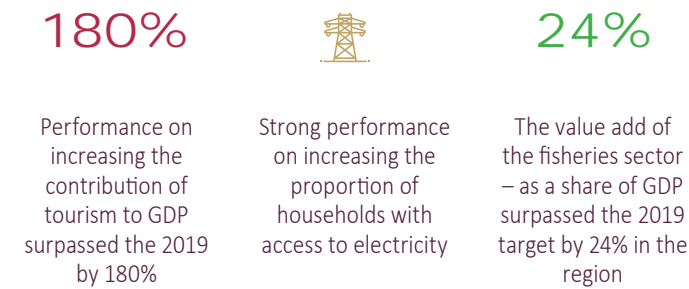
The GAWFA (Gambia Women's Finance Association) project was instrumental in providing access to microcredit to 10,231 low income women in 105 communities from the North Bank region of The Gambia. In addition, 1545 women were trained in Entrepreneurship and Business Skills and 375 women on GAWFA's Mobile Banking Technology platform to perform financial transactions and operations in a more transparent and accountable manner. It is estimated that a total of 25,000 people benefitted from these interventions.

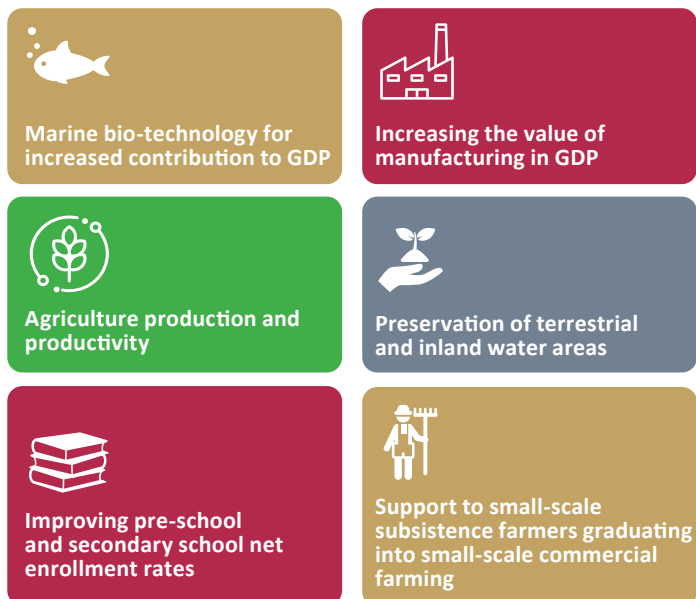
